Town Info

Warner Tax office news: Earlier this year, Janice Cutting retired from her role as Deputy Tax Collector and now serves as the Deputy Treasurer for the Town. Former Tax Collector Marianne Howlett stepped into the Deputy role for a few weeks while training her replacement, but now, **the position of Deputy Tax Collector is open.** The ideal person has some accounting knowledge, enjoys working with the public, has experience processing financial transactions, and gives high priority to detailed accuracy. The Deputy will be most active during our busy tax seasons of June and December, but also fills in when the Tax Collector is unavailable.

The Deputy Tax Collector is a volunteer position which receives a small stipend. Contact Tax Collector Kimberley Edelmann at tax@warnernh.gov or 456-2298 x 4 for information.

Tax bills will be mailed May 30 with a due date of Monday, July 8. The first set of tax bills created by the **new assessing and tax software** look very different from those created by the previous software. The biggest difference is that the tax rates shown are HALF what one might expect. **The tax rates have not changed**; it's just the way the billing software shows them. (July bills are based on the same rate as in December) Another difference is that **the bottom portion of the bill is designed to be sent in with the payment.** Those with multiple properties can still pay with a single check. Payments may be mailed, placed into the drop slot in the Town Hall front door or made in person with the Tax Collector at the Town Hall. The Town Clerk & Deputy are also happy to pass along your payments to the Tax Collector for full processing.

Other changes, such as name or address, and new registrations can also be made. **New Registrations** require a birth certificate and/or passport, as well as a photo ID, and something to show residency. Usually a NH license meets that requirement as long as it has a physical address on the license.

You may always make changes and register at the Town Clerk's Office during normal business hours.





Outdoors, Fitness and Environment

If you love pets and wildlife, don't accidentally poison them! **Rodent populations** can increase dramatically after a big mast year like we had last fall. If you are having a problem with mice, voles or rats, please avoid control products (poisons) that contain an **anticoagulant rodenticide**. Most rodenticides are not rodent-specific, are **extremely toxic to pets and wildlife**, and **accumulate in predators** if they feed on poisoned prey. <u>https://raptorsarethesolution.org/</u> Properly set and tended snap traps are effective for mouse control, and rodent bait containing only powdered corn cob is another safe and natural alternative (thanks Michael Amaral, Warner Conservation Commission). **Related article**: <u>https://wildlife.org/what-is-killing-fishers-in-new-hampshire/</u> "Recent tests have found high levels of rodenticides in fishers throughout New England, and biologists believe that may be a leading cause of mortality in New Hampshire"

Training will include how to use the testing equipment and how to collect and identify macroinvertebrates. Stretchy plastic recycling NEWS - The recycled wood/plastic bench earned by the collection and recycling of 1000 lbs of plastic film will be unveiled on Friday May 31 at 1:15 pm at Simonds School, at a school assembly, public is invited. Another Warner organization will soon start collecting (announcement soon). Meanwhile, you can **deposit your clean plastic film** in the box **inside Market Basket**'s entrance. We also encourage you to try to reduce the amount of plastic waste, by choosing **reusable bags, food containers, and items NOT wrapped in shrink wrap**. This also helps reduce plastic waste volume sent to the incinerator, which reduces what the Town pays to have hauled away, and reduces pollution.
