Tax bills were mailed May 30 with a due date of Monday, July 8. The first set of tax bills created by the new assessing and tax software look very different from those created by the previous software. The tax rates have not changed; it's just the way the billing software shows them. (July bills are based on the same rate as in December)

The bottom portion of the bill is designed to be sent in with the payment. Payments may be mailed, placed into the drop slot in the Town Hall front door or made in person with the Tax Collector at the Town Hall. ## Rethink, Refuse, Reduce, Reuse, Recycle, Repair

**Worried about your taxes? Recycle!** In 2023, recycling in Warner created \$22,661 in revenue, and \$22,093 in avoided tipping fees. Fees for solid waste disposal in 2023 (not including demolition waste and special disposal items) were \$76,091. We can do even better!

Many (new) Warner residents do not seem to know that Warner has a **Transfer and Recycling Station**, and a Solid Waste Ordinance requiring sorting of certain materials! Multiple residents have reported seeing others dumping unsorted waste into the compactor for sending off to the incinerator. This costs the Town money! **There are containers for cardboard, paper, aluminum, metals, various plastics, and glass.** Most of these materials can be sold, and sorting for recycling also helps reduce what taxpayers pay in tipping fees for each ton sent to the incinerator, reduces air pollution and saves landfill space.

Even if you or your landlord pay for a dumpster or other trash pickup service, you can sort and bring recyclables to the TRS, to help reduce taxes (affects rent) and pollution! This newsletter will be including **recycling tips** each week on where to take other items that cost the town (and you) money to dispose of, such as electronics (Staples will take those). Send us your waste reduction tips to share!

#### Stretchy plastic recycling NEWS:

Another Warner organization plans to start collecting the plastic along with the school by September. Meanwhile, you can deposit your clean plastic film/ bags in the box inside Market Basket's entrance. OK items stretch when you pull. If it tears like paper, or is

shiny or makes a crinkly/crunchy sound, do NOT recycle in the bin. https://nextrex.com/ view/educate
