Rethink, Refuse, Reduce, Reuse, Recycle, Repair

Worried about your taxes? Recycle! Fees for solid waste disposal in 2023 (not including demolition waste and special disposal items) were \$76,091 (\$85/ton)!

Tips: Consider joining the **Kearsarge Area Buy Nothing** group on Facebook, particularly for large, bulky items. It's free, people come to YOU (or a chosen location) so you don't have to haul it into town, and the item doesn't sit in the rain or snow until the right person comes along.

For clothing: donation bins at the station, the Family Closet thrift store in Warner for clothes, shoes, kids toys and more. Proceeds go 100% to the food bank. Donations accepted Wednesday and Saturday's 10-4. (or Goodwill!)

For housewares, books, small kitchen appliances, plates, cups and cookware, the Warner Historical Society accepts donations right on their porch which is covered

Stretchy plastic recycling NEWS:

United Church of Warner has started collecting the stretchy plastic(along with the school in September) to recycle at TREX. Bring clean plastic bags and film to the Church, where volunteers will weigh and report the amounts. Or you can **deposit your clean plastic film/ bags** in the box **inside Market Basket**'s entrance.
