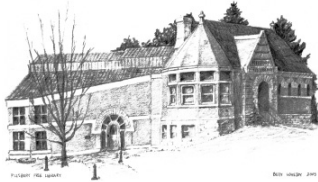

HEB will not be presenting specific trail designs. They will not have a completed environmental review of the project. This is your opportunity to make suggestions and express concerns.

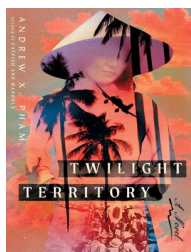

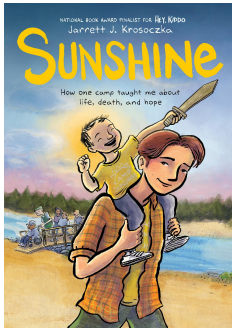
NH State Parks pass - **NH State Parks** are open. **Rollins State Park** on Mt. Kearsarge

Rethink, Refuse, Reduce, Reuse, Recycle, Repair

Most plastics do not recycle well, and it takes chemicals to process them into less durable products. Choose foods in metal, glass or cardboard /paper food packaging instead - and recycle those!

Tip: don't be fooled by "bioplastic". Ingredient PLA is plant derived but chemically altered so it does not degrade. "Commercially compostable plastic" must go in bulk to a commercial facility, which uses chemicals. Avoid it unless Home compostable.

Reduce your taxes: Recycle! Warner Fees for solid waste disposal in 2023 (not including demolition waste and special disposal items) were \$76,091 (\$85/ton)!

Stretchy plastic recycling NEWS:

The **United Church of Warner** has taken on the role of community partner in the ongoing TREX plastic collection project at Simonds School. **Stretchy plastics** may be dropped off **in the TREX box on the porch** of the house next to the Church.

Acceptable items **stretch when you pull**. If it tears like paper, or is shiny or makes a crinkly/crunchy sound, do NOT recycle in the bins. <https://nextrex.com/view/educate>

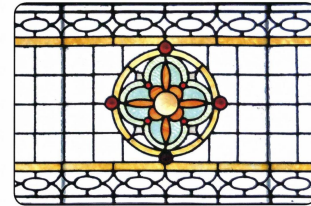
