Library funding update: (see March 20 issue for previous details)

It is still uncertain how the March 14, 2025 <u>Presidential Executive Order</u> directing the minimization of the **Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS)** will affect the congressional funds usually directed to each State Library. Those funds are used to run the <u>NH Interlibrary Loan (ILL) system</u>, The Libby app expenses for <u>downloadable</u> <u>books and magazines</u>, and <u>Talking Books for the Blind and Physically Handicapped</u>.
